MISSION STATEMENT

The Miami Valley Tech Prep Consortium, a partnership among business, secondary and higher education, seeks to strengthen Ohio's workforce competitiveness by facilitating systemic educational change to prepare students for technology-based careers.

GOAL 1:
Expand Tech Prep enrollment to meet Ohio's critical workforce and economic needs.

15% of the 11th and 12th grade students in the Miami Valley Tech Prep Consortium (hereafter MVTPC) will be enrolled in Tech Prep pathways.

66% of students within the MVTPC completing the high school portion of a Tech Prep pathway will matriculate to community colleges and/or universities for the post-secondary portion of the pathway.

25% of all students enrolled in Tech Prep pathways within the MVTPC will be from groups traditionally underrepresented in technology-based occupations.

GOAL 2:
Provide a Tech Prep system that reflects the requirements for success in college and work, and in high skill/high wage careers.

100% of the Tech Prep pathways within the MVTPC offering Tech Prep pathways will have a current local industry verified Technical Competency Profile (TCP), a course of study and a seamless curriculum pathway.

100% of secondary sites within the MVTPC offering Tech Prep pathways will have a corresponding building level instructional team that includes technology, math, science and English instructors as well as an administrator and a counselor.

100% of professional development opportunities sponsored by the MVTPC will be tailored to meet the needs of each Tech Prep stakeholder group.

85% of Tech Prep students within the MVTPC entering the post-secondary portion of a Tech Prep pathway will require no remediation.

GOAL 3:
Maximize student options through the integration of high school, associate degree and baccalaureate degree pathways to achieve a seamless, non-duplicative system.

100% of Tech Prep curriculum documents within the MVTPC will reflect changing labor market needs and will include career exploration.

100% of Tech Prep pathways within the MVTPC will have current and fully executed articulation agreements with secondary partners.

90% of Tech Prep program completers (i.e. Associate Degree) within the MVTPC will, within one year of program completion, transition into full time technology-based employment.

GOAL 4:
Engage the active support and involvement of all Tech Prep stakeholders.

The MVTPC will create new and enhance existing partnerships among business, industry, labor, community, and education.

The MVTPC will capitalize on available regional, state and federal resources to enhance Tech Prep success within the MVTPC.

The MVTPC will continue successful consortium functions and governance structures.

GOAL 5:
Infuse technology into all facets of Tech Prep (instruction, assessment, administration, career decision, and program design).

100% of Tech Prep pathways within the MVTPC will have a technological component.

100% of administration and communication functions and delivery systems within the MVTPC will utilize technology.
