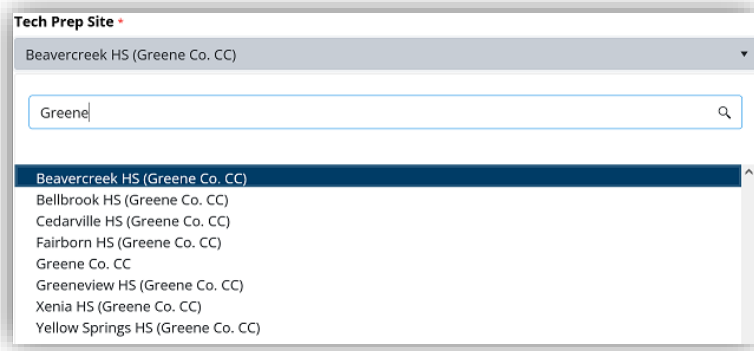

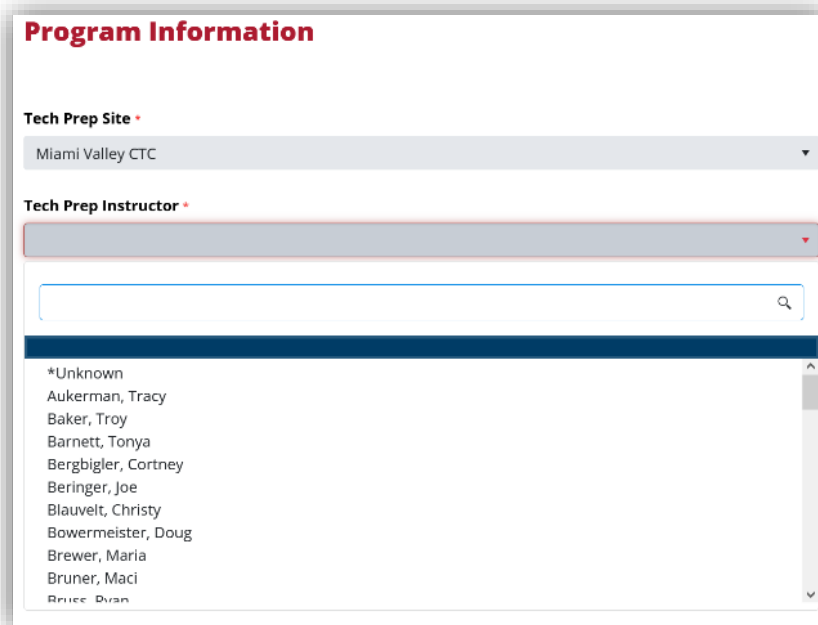
What is my Tech Prep Site?

- This is the location where you are taking career tech courses. Some students are taking courses at their high school, others are taking them at a career tech center.
- Some career tech centers offer courses at satellite locations (other high schools). If you aren't sure what to pick, check with your teacher or one of our staff if on-site.



Why isn't my teacher showing up in the list?

- It could be a few reasons:
 - Doublecheck that you chose the correct Tech Prep Site. If you're not sure, ask your teacher or one of our on-site staff.
 - Is your instructor new? If so, we may not have had a chance to get them added. Ask your teacher or one of our on-site staff who you should pick.



I don't remember my Social Security Number; do I need it?

- Yes, you will need your social security number for your Sinclair Tech Prep application to be processed. However, if you do not have it handy today, simply continue through what you can. When you reach the end of the application, do not submit it. Write down your username and password and log back into the application when you have it.

Oops, I clicked submit without having my Social Security Number. What now?

- Well, it's going to be a little more effort now, but not to worry: If you accidentally submit your Sinclair Tech Prep application without a Social Security Number, you will need to log back into the application later and upload a scan of your Social Security Card. Here's how to do that:
 1. Login to the Sinclair Tech Prep Application at www.sinclair.edu/apply.
 2. Select Review Application.
 3. Go to the Dashboard and select Summary.
 4. Locate the Social Security Card or Visa Requirement.
 5. Follow the steps to upload the scan.

What is an SSID?

- An SSID is a Statewide Student Identifier. It is generally used throughout K-12 as a replacement for your Social Security Number. Your teacher should be able to provide this to you. While it is not required for the Sinclair Tech Prep application, some high schools and career tech centers require you to enter it. Best to check with your teacher to be sure.

Entering your Social Security Number is not required to submit your application. However, a valid Social Security Number is required for financial aid, student employment, federal reporting, and streamlining the process of submitting official transcripts to other colleges and universities.

If you have a Social Security Number and do not provide it when you submit the application, you will be required to submit a copy of your social security card which will cause significant delays in processing your application.
