
COST SAVINGS FOR A TECH PREP STUDENT

Average published tuition costs for one year, full-time undergraduates. Based on 30 credit hours per year



Tech Prep graduate benefits

Earned college credit during career tech program

The average career tech graduate finishes with 3 credit hours in a pathway which translates to a cost savings of \$438 (in-county) tuition.

→ BOGO Summer semester award

3 credit hours = **\$425**

Students who graduate from their career tech program can use the BOGO Summer semester award the summer following high school graduation AND the subsequent summer. To utilize, the student must register for 6 credit hours and Tech Prep covers 3 of those credit hours.

Sinclair Tech Prep Scholarship

To qualify for the **\$3,000** scholarship, a student must earn a 2.25 GPA by the end of their first semester of Senior year, complete 3 or more CTE courses, or 2 courses in a single pathway, and graduate from high school. Student must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester to be eligible for the full scholarship benefits of \$750.00 per term. Enrollment for 9 to 11 hours will be pro-rated at \$563.00 per term. The Sinclair Tech Prep scholarship is last-dollar, meaning other grants/scholarships must be used prior to using the scholarship.
